Adding that under the 11th Malaysia Plan, public and private collaboration was required to drive higher productivity at 3.7% per annum towards a target of labour productivity of RM92.300 per productivity of RM92,300 per employee by 2020.

He said the government agency would foster stronger working relationship with various stakeholders to recognise productivity champions at industry and enterprise levels.
